Hop Into Spring – Perspective of a Volunteer

For the first time in almost 10 years I was able to enjoy a show from a completely different perspective. Not from the eye of a trainer, parent or even competitor. I had several people ask me yesterday where my entourage of children was!

With the long winter behind us I decided that none of my horses or riders was ready for the challenge. With my son now of age to baby sit I was able to live him to watch his younger brother. Lastly my daughter is beginning to explore her own interests and was able to celebrate the Girl Scouts Birthday with her troop. That of course left me alone.

My first thought was yeah, I can show. Then I thought no, I think I will volunteer. So my journey began. I was lucky enough to get to scribe. My decision to volunteer was such a last minute thing that I didn't think I would get that chance. Thanks Sue for making that happen!

For the first time I was able to sit and enjoy my lunch with great friends. Not have to make sure my riders and horses were ready to go, not have to make sure the trailer was clean and everything packed, and not have to make sure my horses and my kids had plenty to drink and eat. Yes I got to relax!

My volunteer job meant me getting there at 8:30 (many of you know I never run on time). So I hooked up my trailer as I had agreed to trailer two wonderful ladies and headed to my first destination. Stopped for gas, and arrived on time. Loaded up and on to pick up the second horse. He got on with only slight hesitation, so off we went headed the back way to the Ag center only to find out one of the roads was closed, so detour it was. All of that and we still arrived at 8:26! Yes that's right I was early!

And so we got to work! What a great job it was. I would suggest that everyone scribe at least one – and then you will probably want to do it again and again. OK, so at first I was a little nervous. "Will I write in the correct boxes?", "will the riders be able to read my writing?", "will I get everything written down?", "will I use shorthand the riders will understand?", wear all fears that ran through my mind, but those fears soon left. The judge I was

working with was wonderful. I did make a couple of mistakes, but she helped me through it and off we went.

Replacing my initial fears was excitement. I got to see everyone's ride's through the judge's eyes. Sometimes when we read a judge's comments we may have missed what they were seeing, but sitting beside them as they are commenting on the horse and rider gives you an understanding of what they are seeing. It also gives you an understanding of the importance of the elements of your test, and yes even where you can make minor mistakes that just might not count.

With this show I got the added bonus of watching the judge school each rider and then watch the rider go again. Each rider took something from the judge, and I got to witness her excitement when the rider was able to improve and her disappointment for the rider when things didn't go well. Yes the judge (and Scribe) is there cheering on every ride as she evaluates you coming down center line. I will come away from this experience being a little more relaxed as I take my future trips down centerline!

It was great to see the show run so smoothly. Kudos to Sue Bothern for organizing such a great day, The judges for their great job, the competitors for giving me something great to watch, and of course all of the volunteers!

I guess after the next show you'll have to read my perspective as a trainer, parent or competitor as it is full steam ahead to get my team in gear for the April show! Hope to see everyone one there and if you aren't riding take the time to volunteer. Being involved behind the scenes always gives us a refreshing perspective.

I woke up this morning to a beautiful day. The air had a little bit of a chill to it but not enough to put on a coat. A light vest was perfect. I went out to the barn where my mare greeted me with ears perked and sparkling soft eyes. I pulled her out for a quick groom and tacked her up.

Walking out to the arena, she was alert and happy. As I mounted her, she stood perfectly still waiting for my instructions. We started out with a nice free walk and then worked up to a beautiful stretchy trot. Tess was very balanced, forward with her back up. I could feel the happiness as her tail switched lightly back and forth as we rode. I asked lightly with my seat for the canter in which she responded immediately with a push from the hindquarters. We went down the long side lengthening her stride and then half halting her around the short ends to compress her stride. She and I both were smiling all through the warm-up. I was feeling confident with my mare as I transitioned into a working frame.

We did working trot pushing from behind in a steady rhythmic gait around the short sides and pushing into an extended trot down the diagonals. Tess was

steady as a rock as my legs reached down with a firm feel of her sides giving her the confidence she needed to perform. As we transitioned into the canter, Tess continued to maintain a beautiful frame with her back up pushing from behind. To strengthen Tess's haunches, we worked on the counter canter along with several transition exercises. Not only was Tess on her game, so was I. My core was strong, my hands were soft, and my legs were steady.

As I brought Tess down to the trot, I let her reach down and into the bit to allow her to stretch down and forward. She took everything I gave her. I asked her to come forward into the walk and gave her several big pats and lots of kudos. We finished our beautiful morning workout with a nice relaxing walk around the property. I love my horse!

Picturing the perfect day with my horse is an interesting concept. It's easy to get caught up in everything that you need to work on, but the truth is that for every bad day there's always a good day that comes after it. What follows is my fantasy of what a perfect day would be like. Hopefully it's my horse Diesel's idea of a perfect day as well. But he can write his own essay.

At the beginning of the day, I would groom Diesel, and he would be thrilled to see me. Sometimes he is, and other times he's a little bit moody. His ears are in a forward position. I told him not to strain anything. Just kidding. But today he looks at me with his eyes soft, not glaring. He's definitely happy to be ridden. I choose to believe his pawing is only his eagerness to get out into the arena.

We go out to the dressage arena, and the minute I get on him I can feel how forward he is. It only takes a few minutes for us to be warmed up and ready. Diesel and I work on our stretching exercises, which have him bending both directions, and it's amazing how well he can bend when he chooses to do so. In my fantasy, Diesel can bend better than a Grand Prix dressage horse.

Then, we move off into something that actually falls under "working trot" (jogging doesn't count, Diesel, we've talked about this) and we go from serpentine to serpentine, falling easily into the rhythm of bending first one way, then the other. He moves out further, and becomes very

balanced. When we pick up the canter, it's easier than it's ever been before. His head doesn't come up, and I can hear how his hooves are going in a steady one two three rhythm. I want to do something a little different, so as we near the top of the circle, I have Diesel trotting, and then we quickly switch leads. There, a flawless simple change. We continue this until we complete a three loop serpentine, and then walk for a minute.

I find that both Diesel and I enjoy trotting poles, although please, don't ask me to jump anything. So anyway, the only thing more awesome than trotting poles is... trotting poles with no stirrups. I listen for the sound of hooves hitting wood, not that this ever happens, but well, you never know. When it doesn't come, I make sure Diesel's bent correctly, and cue him for a left lead canter, and we are suddenly cantering without stirrups. On purpose, I feel compelled to add. It feels like we're floating, and I'm in a balanced enough position that this doesn't accidentally transform into full-fledged flying for me.

By the time we walk for the last time, I find myself in a post-ride high. One of the friends I ride with says that when I do this, I look like the cat that ate the canary. But today, I feel so good I really don't care. When I hand Diesel a Dorito, and give him his favorite treat of all, a rest, he agrees.

 3. No entry will be accepted without a Negative Coggins Test; non-competing horse (**w/\$10 ground fee charge**) must bring a Negative Coggins and check in at the registration table.
 4. Must have a signed release form on file with Wind Drift Farm prior to mounting. If not currently a rider at this establishment, a release form will be available at the registration desk at check in.
 5. All dogs on leashes.
 6. Six ribbons awarded for each class.
